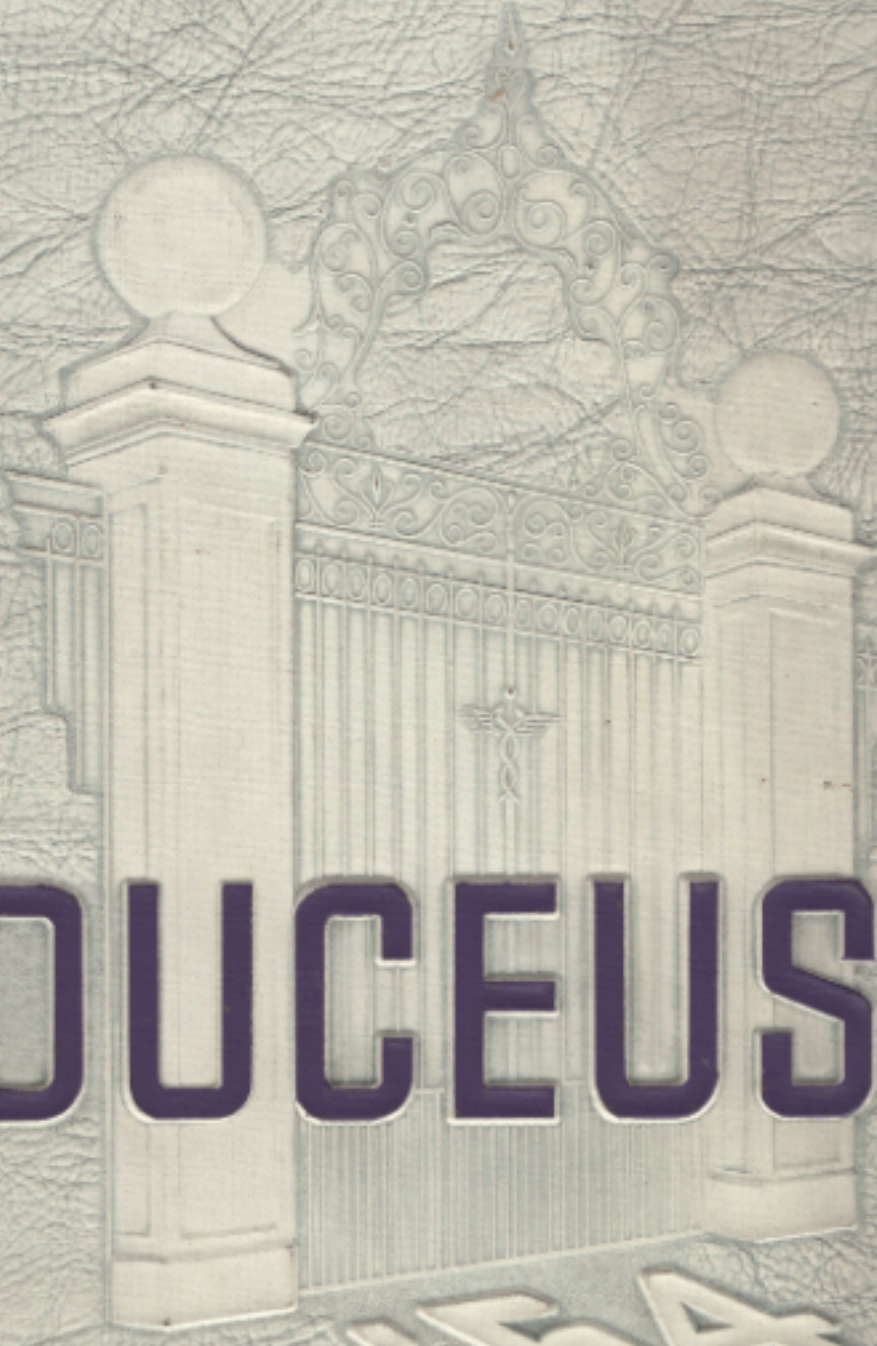

DEAR CLASSMATES OF 1954:

It is a teacher's prayer that his students may avoid the pitfalls, the extravagances, and the indifferences that await their first appearance on the campus and that they may be granted the confidence, the determination, and the control to make an excellent scholastic start immediately and to persevere throughout the four collegiate years.
